	We have changed face-to-face appointment to total triage and only clinically vulnerable patients were seen face-to-face	
	Clinical staff looked after patients through video calls and telephone consultations Nursing Team called patients from vulnerable category and weekly reviewed their health and care needs	
	Temporary suspension of annual reviews for patients with long-term diseases, e.g. diabetes, asthma, COPD, hypertension	
	Face-to-face appointment release gradually as per patients' needs Increased demand for face-to-face-appointment	
	Services re-started partially e.g. childhood and adult immunisations, cervical screening, blood test, spirometry, health checks including long-term disease annual checks	
	Introducing new telephone system and ability to monitor patients' demand and swift response to incoming phone calls	
	Challenging start due to changes of the system and patients' expectations The system is in full use and beneficial to the surgery Ability to monitor incoming calls throughout the day	
	Opportunity to monitor demand and how to allocate additional staff to answer calls	
	Promoting short messaging system during pandemic, ability to communicate with patients via short messaging service (AccuRX)
